STEP 1

The Warm and Well advice line¹ offers a free, impartial and local **one-stop-shop** for domestic energy advice and support. From simple energy saving ideas right through to having an energy survey of your home, accessing sources of funding or locating installers in your area, our advisors can give you all the help you need.

Your first step is to call and speak to one of our qualified energy advisors free (0800 500 3076), who can tell you what help is available and can offer some simple energy saving ideas.



STEP 2



Step two is a Green Deal Assessment² of your home. Our team of qualified assessors will carry out a full technical survey and produce an Energy Performance Certificate. They will do a full assessment of fuel bills and actual energy usage to assess the likely impact of any improvements.

Whether you're a homeowner or a privately-renting tenant, giving your home an energy MOT with a Green Deal Assessment could help you improve your home and save you money on your bills. A range of energy improvement measures are available through the Green Deal.³

If you need improvements carried out on your home, step three will be to find a suitable source of finance. If you're on certain benefits or you live in a home classed as hard to treat, some improvements may be eligible for discounts through the Energy Company Obligation (ECO).⁴

You may have the capital yourself, alternatively you may choose to take out a loan through the Green Deal. We can take you through the different options.

STEP 4

Step four is to find an installer to carry out the work. Whether you are using grant funding, a loan, your own capital or a mixture, we can help you find suitable local installers to quote for the work.
